YWCA Brooklyn furthers its mission by providing 300 units of safe, affordable housing for low-income women, most of whom are survivors of gender-based violence; a college access and leadership program serving 400 low-income girls of color; education and legal assistance for immigrant women; and a community center that is a nexus for over 100 progressive grassroots organizations.

Director of Philanthropy - The YWCA Brooklyn seeks a full-time Director of Philanthropy works closely with the CEO and Board of Directors to develop a fundraising plan outlining clear strategies and tactics to meet stated goals. This position also cultivates relationships with a portfolio of high potential donors and corporations to engage them with the goal of increasing contributions.
